

1. Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006 (REACH)

The company Carl Stahl Technocables GmbH operates according to EU Regulation 1907/2006 (REACH-VO) of 18 December 2006 as a downstream user and supplier of products from which no substances are intentionally released for an additional function. According to information from our suppliers, the materials used by us contain no substances from the list of candidates (SVHC list) in a concentration of more than 0.1% by mass.

We are in constant contact with our suppliers.

As soon as we determine that our products are obliged to be notified according to Art. 33, we will inform you about this without being asked.

2. EU Directive RoHS (2011/65/EU)

The European Union's Directive 2011/65/EU on the restriction and use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (RoHS) entered into force on 3 January 2013. These are in particular the following substances:

0.1% by weight per homogeneous material:

- a) Lead,
- b) Mercury,
- c) Hexavalent chromium,
- d) Polybrominated biphenyl (PBB),
- e) Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE),
- f) Di (2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP),
- g) Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP),
- h) Dibutyl phthalate (DBP) or
- i) Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP) or
- j) Cadmium 0.01% by weight per homogeneous material.

Carl Stahl Technocables GmbH hereby declares that our products are manufactured in accordance with RoHS. If exemptions are made, we will notify you separately for each product.

3. Conflict Minerals - Dodd-Frank Act - Regulation (EU) 2017/821

On 15 July 2010, the US Congress passed the Wall Street Reform Act, which also includes a Conflict Minerals regime. The law applies to companies that use **tantalum, tin, tungsten, or gold** in their products or to manufacture their products, and requires those companies to submit an annual report to the US Securities and Exchange Commission stating whether these minerals originate from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or from neighbouring countries.

In Europe, Regulation (EU) 2017/821 came into force on 17 May 2017 establishing obligations to fulfill due diligence measures of the supply chain for Union importers of tin, tantalum, tungsten, their ores and gold from conflict-affected and high-risk areas.

In order to meet the needs of our customers, we have actively asked our relevant suppliers to provide us with information whether the materials we use originate from conflict and high risk areas.

Currently there are no indications that our products could contain the "so-called Conflict Minerals".
